

READING 1: FASHION AND YOU!

So, what do your clothes say about you? You might think that nobody notices what you wear and how you wear it, but think again. When was the last time you judged someone because of their outfit? We do it all the time. When we see someone wearing designer clothes and holding the latest must-have handbag, we automatically label them as a 'fashion victim'. When we see someone wearing a smart business suit, we think that they must be successful. When we see someone wearing scruffy clothes, we think the opposite. And when we see someone wearing black clothes, with dyed black hair and painted black fingernails, we automatically label them as a 'goth'. We can't help noticing people's clothes and trying to guess what message they're sending out to the world.

Like it or not, the way we dress is the external expression of our personalities. But this doesn't mean that we should dress for other people. You don't need to follow trends or try to impress anyone else. The important thing is to find your own style and to feel good about what you are wearing. If you wear the clothes that suit you and that make you happy, you will look great and people will notice you for all the right reasons. Happiness is the best accessory, and you won't find it in a department store!
