4. Don't work. Robert Kiyosaki, the famous author of 'Rich Dad Poor Dad', says that perhaps you should try to start your own (12) _____ business instead of working for someone else. Does that mean you should be the boss? No, he says, (13) _____ a boss takes too much time and hard work. Pay someone to be the company boss for you. Very simply, you should first (14) _____ a business and then make your money do all the work.

5. Start young and keep learning (15) _____ your money mistakes. You are human and over time you will make many of them. But it's easier to lose ten thousand dollars when you are twenty-five than when you are sixty-five.
