Tourism – a benefit or a problem?

As all parts of the world become easier to reach and more and more people are able to travel, tourism is having a huge effect on many areas and many people's lives. The question to be asked is whether this effect is positive or negative.

Some people believe tourism is a good thing. They say that the biggest advantage for people is that tourism creates 5 jobs. Many communities couldn't survive without it. Hotel and restaurant workers, shopkeepers, taxi drivers and others all rely on tourism. In addition, passengers pay taxes which allow governments to build new roads, airports, schools and hospitals.

Tourism can also help to preserve local traditions. This may not seem to be the case when another unspoilt seaside 10 resort is transformed by high-rise, modern hotels but, in many places, tourists want to see traditional villages and ways of life and, in such cases, money is sent to help communities so that tourism will continue.

In addition, tourism can help the environment. Again, this isn't always obvious and it hasn't always been true but, nowadays, governments are more likely to spend money on protecting national parks and beauty spots than on building resorts. This isn't always because they appreciate nature but they are aware that an unspoilt landscape is often worth more than a modern resort.

15 So, there are some benefits but these don't always make up for the problems caused. Take the economic benefits for example. Although governments receive taxes from tourists, they are forced to spend more than they earn. In addition, while it is true that tourism creates employment opportunities, these are often temporary and can do nothing to prevent unemployment outside of the main holiday season. The jobs also tend to be low-paid but, at the same time, tourism pushes up the prices of food and accommodation making people worse off than before.

20 There is also a negative effect on communities. There is often overcrowding during the summer meaning traffic jams on the roads and difficulties in leading a normal life during the holiday season. There can be noise and anti-social behaviour and, occasionally, communities can be completely wiped out if, for example, real estate becomes so valuable that local people are forced to leave their land and homes so that more hotels and restaurants can be built.

Finally, even if governments create protected areas, there is more traffic on the roads outside which leads to 25 pollution which can affect the plants in the national parks. Also, the high number of tourists means a significant increase in the demand for water. This means less water flows into rivers, which dry up causing plants and animals to die.

As can be seen, although governments are trying hard to act more responsibly than in the past, the huge numbers of tourists now travelling every year is causing problems that it may be impossible to solve.
