Conditionals

Type 1

USES

talk about present or future situations

real

FORMS

If simple, Future simple.

S + will/can/must/may + V

If I feel sick, I won't go to work.

If he wants to pass the exam, he should study hard.

If Present, Imperative.

give instruction & advice

If you are tired, take a rest.

If you see the red button, don't press it.

NOTES

If not ... = Unless

If it does not rain, we will go on a picnic.

Unless it rains, we will go on a picnic.

Type 2

USES

present or future situations in reality

1. If we had money, we could afford a car.

give advice

2. If I were you, I should see a doctor.

If I were you, I would study harder.

FORMS

If Past simple, S + /could/might + V.

If + S + were (not was)

Type 1 & 2

FORMS

If present simple, S + will/can/must/may + V.

If present simple, S + would/could/might + V.

USES

TYPE 1

possible present or future situations

If she wins the contest this year, she will be Miss World.

TYPE 2

impossible present or future situations

If she wins the contest this year, she will be Miss World.
