REMEMBER

AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	INTERROGATIVE
I/You/We/They eat pizza.	I/You/We/They don't eat pizza.	Do I / you / we / they eat pizza?
She/he/It lives in a town.	She/he/It doesn't live in a town.	Does she /he / it live in a town?
		Yes, I do . No, I don't .
		Yes, she does . No, she doesn't .

3rd PERSON SINGULAR	Most verbs add -s : live -> lives
SPELLING RULES	Verbs ending in -o, -ch, -sh, -ss, -x , add -es : go -> goes / watch -> watches / wash -> washes
(She / He / It)	Verbs ending in consonant + -y cut -y and add -ies : study -> studies

We can use the Present Simple **to talk about facts, habits or routines**.

Time expressions: every day/week/month, once/twice/three times a month, in the morning/afternoon/evening, at the weekend, on Mondays/Tuesdays, at 8 o'clock...

! DON'T FORGET Adverbs of frequency (always, usually, often, sometimes, never...) go **before the verb** but **after to be**.

E.g. She **often goes out** with her friends. / We **are often** at home on Saturday.
