Seventy years ago, Karl von Frisch discovered that bees dance to tell each other where to find food. He insisted that bees could communicate better than birds. **A** _____.

In the animal kingdom, monkeys use 36 different calls to communicate, including alarm calls for different kinds of danger. When they hear different calls they behave differently. According to Julia Bell, a researcher, we shouldn't be surprised that more intelligent animals have better language skills. We know that animals communicate. **B** _____. Today scientists are teaching different types of animals to communicate with humans. They started with monkeys and they have had some success. They are now working with dolphins and they're making good progress in their projects.

Research communication between humans and monkeys started in the 1930s, when scientist started teaching chimpanzees. **C** _____, for example, when they told them to sit down or not to be noisy they understood. But they soon found that chimpanzees couldn't produce many human sounds, so researchers tried other ideas. In the 1960s, a chimpanzee called Washoe and a gorilla called Koko were taught American Sign Language, the system that deaf people use to speak with their hands. Scientists believe that chimpanzees use language like a human child of two and a half years old. **D** _____, scientists are becoming more and more interested in animal-human communication. They've known that animals communicate with each other for a long time, but now they can see how 'talking' to animals could help scientists understand animals better.
