Other soldiers will **look down on** you if you cause problems, and their unfavorable opinion of you can prevent successful teamwork.

DSRul says... I will always remember my Drill Sergeant with great respect. I **look up to** him because he made me the soldier I am today and he **challenged** me to do my best. He would always tell us, "If you give up here, you'll **surrender** in battle." Because of him I'll never give up in anything I do. Thank you Drill Sergeant Adams.

ME2 says... Something else I wanted to say is this: if you are **willing** to work hard, you can **count on** having a positive experience at Basic. But, you can be sure that you will have a tough time if you don't do your best. Just live one day **at a time**, and you can succeed! And find another soldier you can count on to help you out when you need it.

GR8PV says... Drill Sergeants can make you feel **inferior** at times, but they are only trying to make you excellent soldiers. Sometimes they like to punish everyone if one person makes a mistake.
