Writing Strategy

Make sure your essay has a clear, logical structure.

Paragraph 1: Introduction. Rephrase the question and/or give an example of the situation it describes to show that you have understood it.

Paragraph 2: Give two or three pros (arguments for). Include evidence and/or examples where appropriate.

Paragraph 3: Give two or three cons (arguments against). Include evidence and/or examples where appropriate.

Paragraph 4: Conclusion. Sum up the most important or convincing arguments and give your opinion.

Some people think that one year's military service should be compulsory for everyone when they leave full-time education. What are the advantages and disadvantages of military service?

Many people believe that young men – and possibly women – should complete a year of military service after leaving school. There are some advantages to this, but also many drawbacks.

To begin with, it is sometimes argued that military service helps to build character by teaching people the military ethos of protecting others and working together for the greater good. By the same token, people often learn skills that they use in later life. For example, many people first get their driver's licence – or learn to cook and clean – in the military. Last but not least, some nations need manpower to defend themselves against hostile neighbours. Scrapping military service would jeopardise their security.

By contrast, many people maintain that military service prevents millions of young people from getting on with their lives. The reasoning is as follows: understandably, some people stay in higher education for years to avoid doing military service. Similarly, many employers are reluctant to give people permanent jobs until they've done their military service. In other words, military service has a much bigger impact on a person's life than the year they actually spend in uniform. Another compelling argument against military service is the obvious fact that people can be sent to war. There is a strong argument for saying that people who go to war should be career soldiers, who have accepted the risk.

To sum up, compulsory military service has some benefits for both countries and individuals. But overall, I feel that these benefits are outweighed by the serious impact on young people's lives.
