



**Guided tour of my factory**

We all drink soft drinks or mineral water out of plastic bottles. But did you know plastic bottles start life as small, solid tubes of plastic called pre-forms? These pre-forms <sup>1</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (transform) into plastic bottles by machines in a factory. In my factory, 70 million plastic bottles <sup>2</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (produce) every year. That's a lot of bottles!



So let's see how pre-forms <sup>3</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (turn into) your soft drink bottles.

First, they <sup>4</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (carry) by a long conveyor belt into an oven, where they <sup>5</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (heat) very quickly to 125°C. Then, the extremely hot tubes <sup>6</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (put) inside two-litre bottle moulds.

**Guided tour of my factory**

Next, air is blown into the tube at high pressure, and the plastic becomes the shape of the bottle mould.

Finally, cold water is circulated around the mould so the bottle is cooled instantly. And that's it! The bottles are delivered to a drinks factory, where they're filled with your favourite drinks.
