- HABLAR DE HECHOS O VERDADES UNIVERSALES:
WATER BOILS AT 100 DEGREES (EL AGUA HIERVE A 100 GRADOS)
- HABLAR DE HORARIOS DE TRENES, AVIONES...:
MY TRAIN LEAVES AT 5 P.M. (MI TREN SALE A LAS 5 DE LA TARDE)
