

The Nassau Grouper

An **ecosystem** is a place where living and non-living things interact with each other and depend on each other. The grouper lives in the **coral reef ecosystem**. They often rest on the seafloor under ledges, around caves and in cracks on the reef.



The Nassau grouper is endangered mainly because of overfishing. The overfishing of the Nassau grouper is common because they gather in predictable places and predictable times to mate and spawn. This makes them an easy target for fishermen. Catching the fish at this time before they are able to reproduce lessens the number of groupers we will have to eat, and will threaten the likelihood of people enjoying grouper in the future.

To protect the Nassau Grouper, a closed season from December 1st to February 28th was established. This gives the Nassau grouper a chance to reproduce. The more fish that successfully spawn now, the more fish there will be to catch and eat later. Other measures of protection are:

- Marine parks and reserves where fishing of the grouper is prohibited
- Enforcement of the minimum legal harvest size of three pounds.
