SUBJECT PRONOUNS are the **subject** of the sentence. They do the actions.

OBJECT PRONOUNS are the **object** of the sentence. They receive an action.

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES always come before a noun that they modify. They explain that the noun belongs to someone.

POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS state that the subject of a sentence belongs to someone. They don't need a noun afterwards.
