

- An adverb of manner is usually formed by adding -ly to an adjective

Examples:

She is beautiful. - adjective

She sings beautifully. - adverb

Adjective + ly = adverb

- Spelling:

-y → -ily

happy - happily

-le → -ly

terrible - terribly

-ic → -ically

ironic - ironically

- other exceptions: full - fully, true - truly, public - publicly

- note: note all the words ending in -ly are adverbs - examples: friendly, silly, etc
