Definitions of weather idioms

to say or do something to make someone feel at ease in a social setting.	to be there no matter what or whatever the weather.
to have so much to do	when someone tries to do something that they will not achieve
peaceful period before a moment of great activity	There is always something positive to come out of a difficult situation.
person who is only your friend during good times.	when things don't just go wrong but very wrong
it's pouring down	to be out of touch of reality.
to postpone for another day.	to be very easy to do
when someone takes attention away from someone else	to be extremely happy.
when someone makes a small problem larger than it really is.	to feel fine and healthy
to save for the future when it might suddenly be needed	there is a chance that something positive will happen.
decline something now but offer to do it at a later date.	you are not feeling well
