

It was the largest stadium in the entire Roman Empire. The Romans built it over 2,500 years ago in wood, but after it burned down a few times in fires, it was rebuilt in stone. It was a stadium mainly for chariot races, but they also used it for other events and games. The last known race was in the year 549.

It was free for everyone to go and see the races.

Men, women and children attended the events. The rich people sat at the top and the poor people sat at the bottom, where it was more dangerous. The stadium was huge and held about 150,000 people. That's bigger than the stadiums we've got today!



Many thousands more people could watch from the nearby hills.
