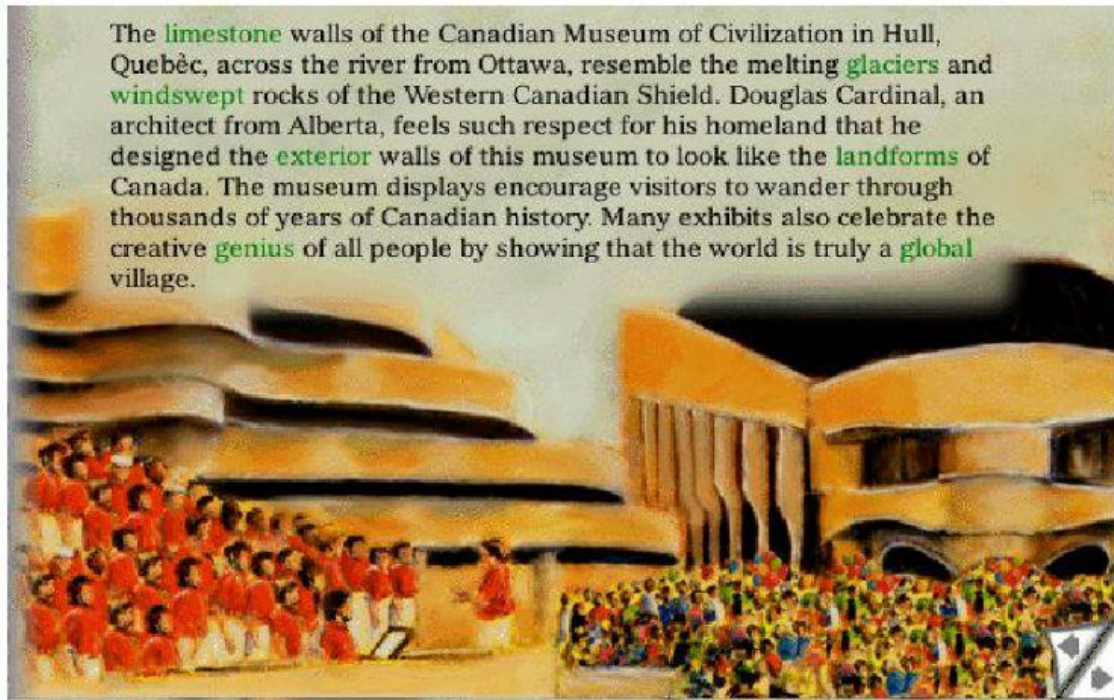

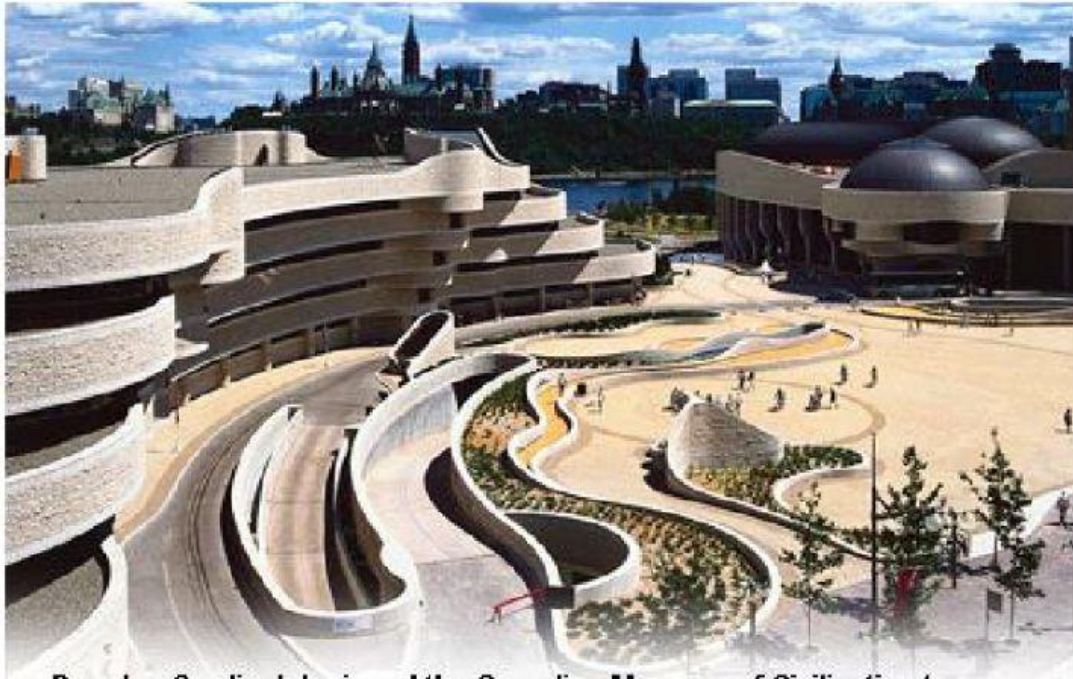

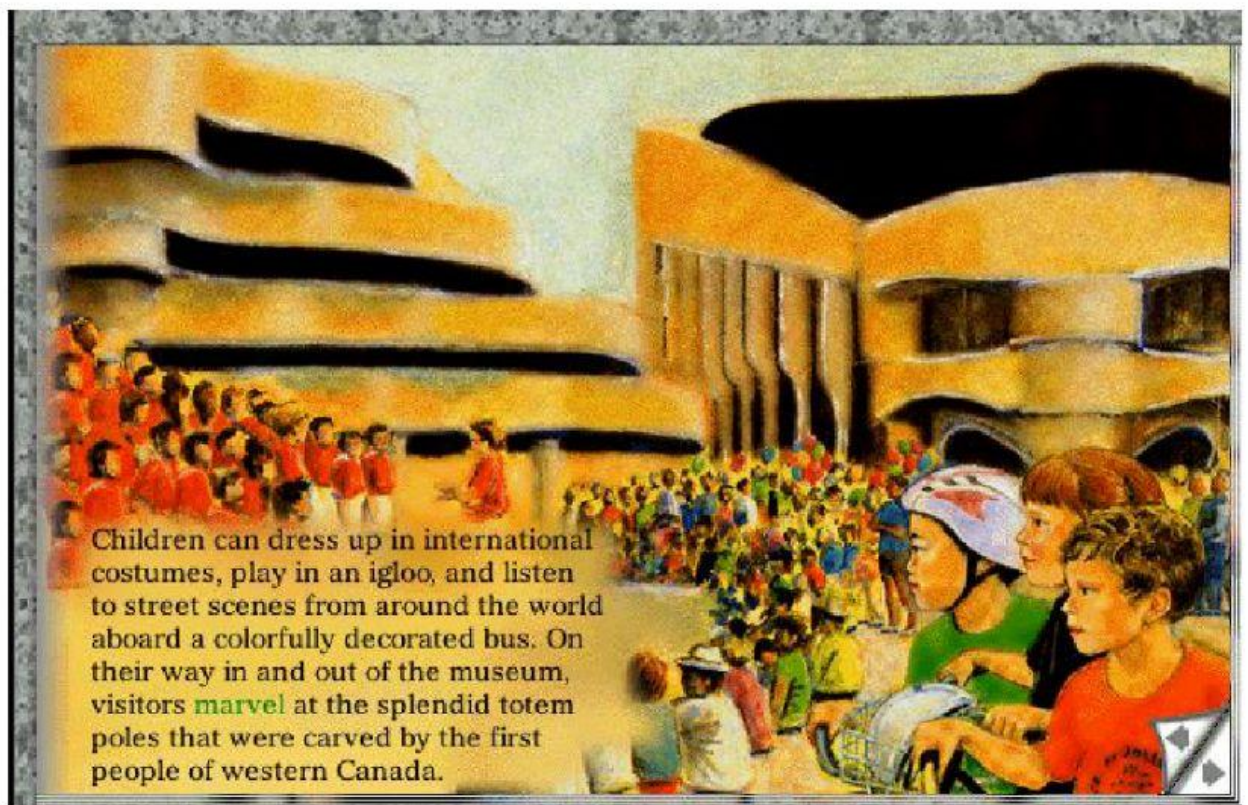

Douglas Cardinal designed the Canadian Museum of Civilization to appear molded more by the natural forces of wind, rain, and glaciers than by human tools.
