- An organized society with developed Knowledge (of farming,crafts, trade, government, art, technology, science and laws)who live in cities and trades with other societies.
- A group of states (or territories) and peoples under the rule of one ruler (or state)
- To become expert in a certain skill
- Trading one product for another without using money as a medium of exchange
- A craftsman (skilled worker) who specializes in producing one particular craft
- People who could write and record data
- A person who makes a living by trading
- A city and the countryside around it under the rule of one government
- People who have moved into towns and cities to work and live
- An artificial mountain with terraces which serve as a temple
- Writing symbols that represent objects
- A system of writing using wedge-shaped symbols used by the sumerians
- A system of writing in which symbols represent sounds
- Sharpened reed used as a writing tool
