

### Real conditionals

Real conditionals are formed by two clauses. One *main clause* with the *result*, and one *conditional clause* with the *condition*.

Choose the sentences that express real conditions.

- a. When I have an exam, I get scared to death.
- b. I'll go on vacation whenever classes are finished.
- c. When you're in control of yourself, you have to lower the anxiety level.
- d. If you won the lottery, you would eat all the hamburgers in the planet.

1. I **panic** about spiders **when they are big**.

Structure:

Subject + simple \_\_\_\_\_ in the main clause + \_\_\_\_\_ + \_\_\_\_\_ + simple \_\_\_\_\_

Both the main clause and the condition have a verb in \_\_\_\_\_. Therefore, this conditional refers to the \_\_\_\_\_.

2. If I **have** free time, I **will go** to the therapist.

Structure:

\_\_\_\_\_ + subject + simple \_\_\_\_\_, + subject \_\_\_\_\_ in the main clause

When I have free time

I will go to the therapist

3. Whenever you **receive** your payment, you **must** pay the rent.

Structure:

\_\_\_\_\_ + subject + \_\_\_\_\_, + \_\_\_\_\_ + \_\_\_\_\_
