Language Focus Statements with Rising Intonation



You heard the following exchange in the conversation:

Mari: So, when people say, "How are you?" they're just being polite? They don't really care?

Nancy: Not exactly.

Note that Mari's questions are actually statements: "They're just being polite?", "They don't really care?" with rising intonation. This way of talking is often used in rapid, informal English, especially when the speaker is surprised or expects an affirmative answer.
