The story was written down but the monster did not become famous until more modern times.

In 1933, George Spicer and his wife saw a strange animal cross the road in front of their car. It then _____ into the lake and swam away. In the same year, an excited man took the first photo of the monster. He saw the monster's tail and large body splashing in the water. In 1934, Arthur Grant saw Nessie just after midnight when he was riding his motorbike. In 1935, a doctor took a photo, which _____ a long neck and a small head sticking up out of the water. This became the best known photo of Nessie. Since that photo, many people _____ their own versions of Nessie, in fact, the photo _____ as an inspiration to imagine new monsters for more than 50 years.

There _____ many photos but none are clear. In 1987, scientists used sound equipment to search for Nessie. On the first day, they detected a large object, suggesting an animal larger than a shark but not as big as a whale. On the second and third day they found nothing. Experts believe it was a seal swimming along the River Ness to the loch. To this day, nobody _____ if the monster really exists but it continues to be a great story.
