Amelia Edwards (1831-1892) is sometimes called 'the godmother of Egyptology'. Her work helped preserve the artefacts of ancient Egypt for the world to see today. Edwards didn't grow up with dreams of becoming an archaeologist. As a child she loved to write, paint, draw and make music. She had had a poem published by the age of seven and her first story at the age of twelve. A famous artist of the day, George Cruikshank, offered to train her as an artist, but Edwards' mother and father felt it was a poor career choice. The family didn't have enough money and so until the age of thirty, when her parents died, Amelia worked as a writer of novels, articles, history books and poetry in order to help them.

However, she often wondered if she should have become an artist. At thirty, Edwards was unmarried and alone. She had a love of travel and she was free to explore the world. On 27 June 1872, she set off on a trip through the Dolomite mountains with her friend Lucy Renshaw. Back then, even people with a university education had not heard of the Dolomites, but Edwards had seen some Italian paintings of the area and was determined to go there. Edwards enjoyed the challenging journey and wrote a book about it, *Untrodden Peaks and Infrequent Valleys*.

When they came down from the mountains, Edwards was unhappy about her return to civilisation and the end of their trip. The friends set off on a walking tour of France, but heavy rain stopped them and instead, they decided to travel to Egypt. Edwards and Renshaw were soon on a boat sailing down the Nile - the only way to explore the region in those days. When Edwards first saw the Great Pyramid, it made a huge impression on her. She fell in love with Egypt's rich archaeology, which was just beginning to be discovered. She spent six weeks digging at the Temple of Rameses II as well as writing a book about her journey. The book, *A Thousand Miles up the Nile*, set the world on fire and

is still in print today.

However, other things that Edwards saw in Egypt made her worried and angry. Tourists and collectors were destroying the historical sites. People carved their names into the ancient monuments. Everyone who visited stole artefacts and sold them illegally. She became determined to protect Egypt's archaeological history from people who just wanted to make money and the growing tourism industry. Back in London, Edwards set up the Egypt Exploration Fund in 1882. The fund allowed young archaeologists to travel to Egypt and help to preserve the valuable artefacts.

Edwards spent the rest of her life raising money for it through articles, letters, books and talks. When Edwards died in 1892, she left her collection of Egyptian artefacts, her library and £5,000 to University College London. Her collection was the beginning of the world-famous Petrie Museum of Egyptian Archaeology. It is named after Flinders Petrie who was one of the archaeologists Edwards helped to go to Egypt and who collected most of the artefacts there. However, without the work of Amelia Edwards, it would not have existed, and neither would many of the amazing historical artefacts from ancient Egypt that the world knows of today.
