Describe Plot

In this lesson, you will . . .

- learn about the sequence of events in a story
- understand how some stories follow a pattern
- identify how characters can affect what happens

Learn about Plot

Plot is what happens in a story.

The plot includes the conflict, sequence of events, and resolution in story.

The **sequence of events** tells the plot in the order things happen. One event leads to another, then other events follow.

Words such as *first*, *next*, *then*, and *finally* help order the sequence of events.



Understand the Sequence of Events

"Whew!" Chloe spoke up. "We've never met a shark before. But you are a hero to us!"



Plot has a Shape

Many stories follow a pattern of events. Here is one pattern a story may follow.



Conflict is a challenge in a story. A conflict can be a problem that a character must solve or a difficult task that must be completed.

The **resolution** is how the problem in the story is solved. The events in the climax help solve the story's conflict.



Characters Can Affect Plot

Characters can change what happens in a story with thoughts, words, and behaviors.

A character's behavior is an **action**. This action can cause other events to happen or other characters to respond.

Those events and responses are a **reaction**.
