They drove to the park at one o'clock.

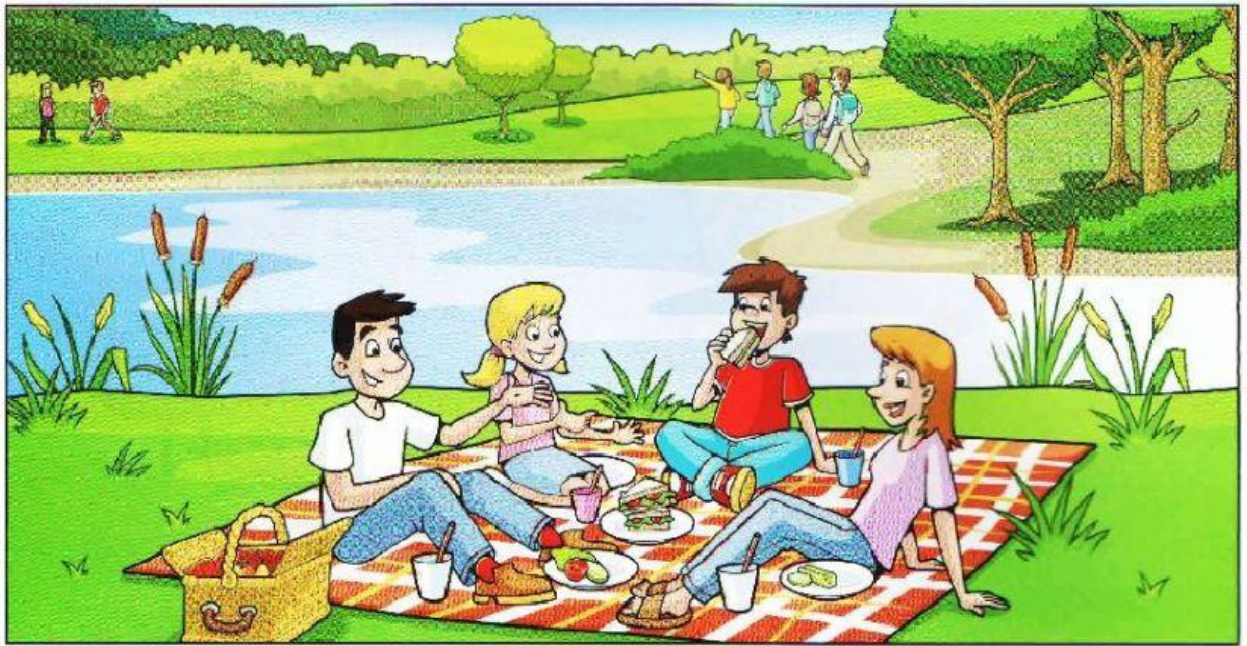

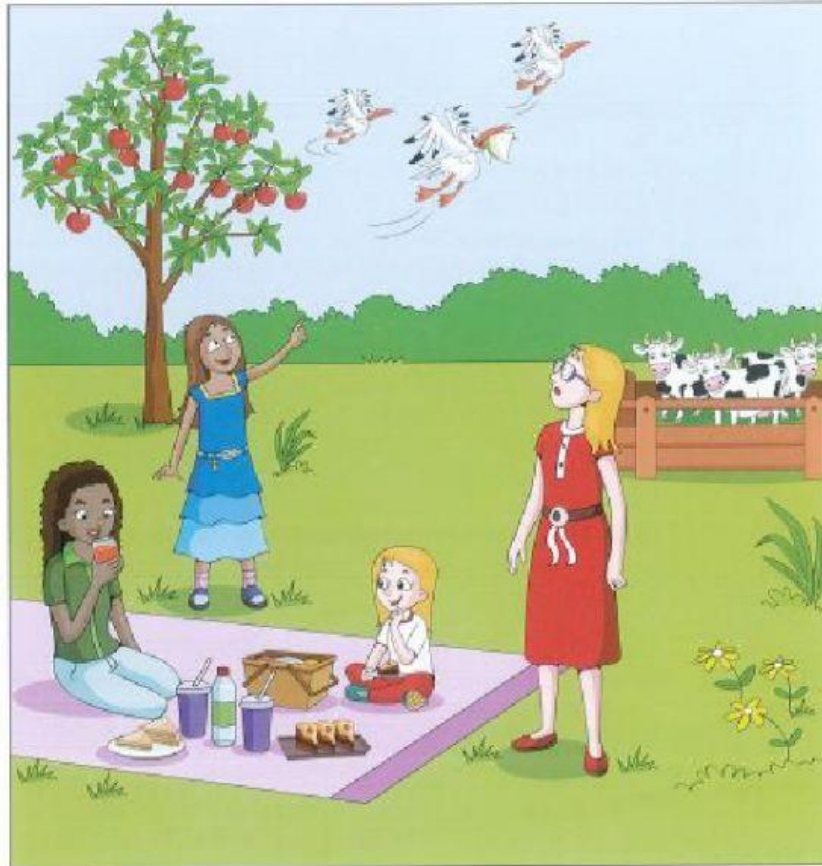
