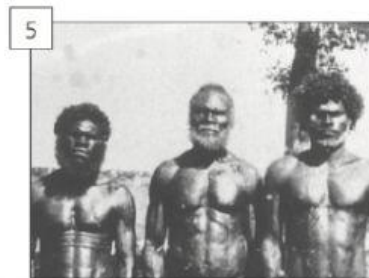
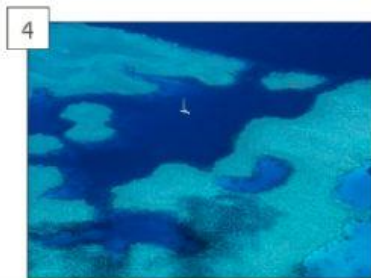

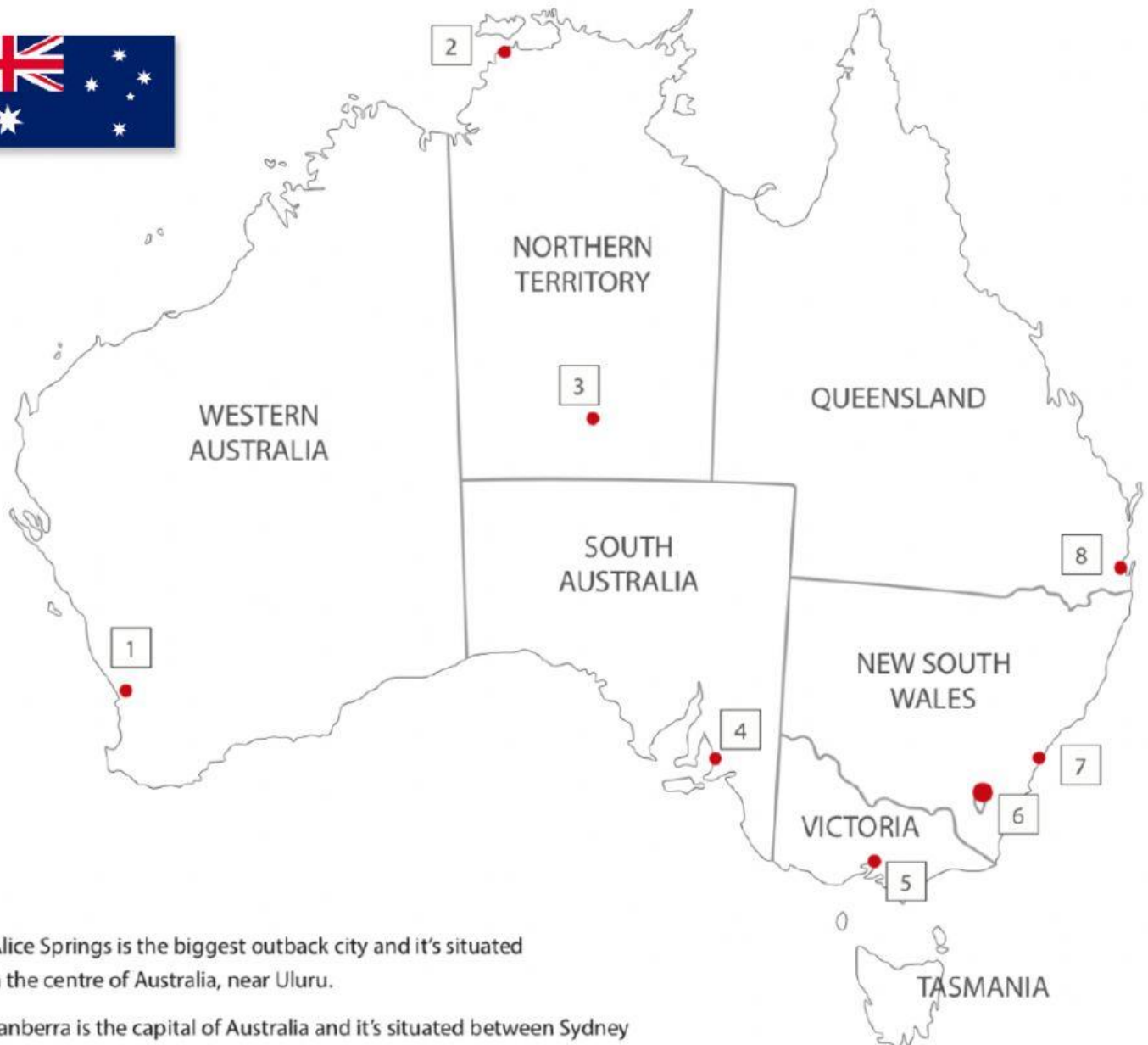

These are the main cities in Australia with a brief description. Read the description and situate them on the map.



- Alice Springs is the biggest outback city and it's situated in the centre of Australia, near Uluru.
- Canberra is the capital of Australia and it's situated between Sydney and Melbourne, but not on the coast. It's the newest of Australian cities.
- Melbourne it's the second biggest city in Australia and it's situated on the south coast of Australia, near Tasmania.
- Sydney is the oldest and biggest city in Australia and it's situated on the coast, between Canberra and Brisbane.
- Brisbane is the third largest city in Australia and it's on the east coast, opposite the Great Barrier Reef.
- Darwin is on the north coast of Australia. Its name comes from the British scientist Charles Darwin.
- Adelaide is well-known for its music and film festivals. It's called the City of Churches (because there are many of them here) and it's on the south coast of Australia, in the state of South Australia.
- Perth is on the west coast of Australia.
