

Irregular verbs:



He ate lots of bananas yesterday.

To make the **past simple**, we add **-ed** or **-d** to most verbs. Irregular verbs make the past simple in different ways.

buy → bought	eat → ate	make → made	take → took
come → came	give → gave	read → read	write → wrote
do → did	go → went	see → saw	
drink → drank	have → had	sit → sat	

Affirmative

I/you/he/she/it/we/they **drank**.

Negative

I/you/he/she/it/we/they **didn't drink**.

When we make negative sentences with **didn't**, we use the main verb.

He **didn't drink** lots of milk. ✓ He ~~didn't drank~~ lots of milk. ✗

Questions

Did I/you/he/she/it/we/they **drink**?

Short answers

Yes, I/you/he/she/it/we/they **did**.

No, I/you/he/she/it/we/they **didn't**.

When we make questions with **Did**, we use the main verb.

Did he **drink** lots of milk? ✓ ~~Did~~ he ~~drank~~ lots of milk? ✗
