

Using Prefixes **un** and **dis**

A prefix is a letter or group of letters added to the front of a word.

When used, the prefix **un** or **dis** makes a word that is opposite in meaning. For example:

A. **Un** added to happy makes the word **un**happy.

Unhappy means not happy.

B. **Dis** added to honest makes the word **dis**honest.

Dishonest means not honest.
