- “Tale as old as time.” – Anti-Hero (Midnights)
- “I had the shiniest wheels, now they’re rusting.” – this is me trying (folklore)
- “Well, you can take me down with just one single blow.” – Mean (Speak Now)
- “Walking through a crowd, the village is aglow.” – Welcome to New York (1989)
- “I’m a crumpled up piece of paper lying here.” – All Too Well (Taylor’s Version) [Red (Taylor’s Version)]
- “I ask the traffic lights if it’ll be alright, they say, “I don’t know”.” – Death by a Thousand Cuts (Lover)
- “Your touch brought forth an incandescent glow, tarnished but so grand.” – ivy (evermore)
- “I guess it’s true that love was all you wanted ‘cause you’re giving it away like it’s extra change.” – Tied Together With A Smile (Taylor Swift)
- “We were jet-set, Bonnie and Clyde, until I switched to the other side.” – Getaway Car (Reputation)
