



Simple Future with Will



Will future expresses a spontaneous decision, an assumption with regard to the future or an action in the future that cannot be influenced.



Affirmative Statements

I will go to Costa Rica next year.

Negative Statements

She will not buy a new house.

Questions:

Where will you go next summer?

1) Write sentences with the affirmative form of will.

Example: (I/call/you): "I will call you." / "I'll call you."

- a) (They /help/you)
- b) (He /stay/ home tonight)
- c) (My friends /go to the beach)
- d) (Peter /buy/ the tickets)
- e) (My boyfriend /cook/ dinner tonight.)
- f) (They/understand/you)

2) Write negative sentences in the future.

Example (I/answer/the question): "I **will not** answer the question" / "I **WON'T** answer the question"

- a) (My brother /close/the door).
- b) (The boy/catch/the ball.)
- c) (I /read/that magazine).
- d) (We /buy/ that present to my uncle)
- e) (My grandmother /open/the door.)
- f) (The children /eat/ fish.)

3- Ask the questions. Example 1: (you / go / to the party)? **“Will you go to the party?”**

Example 2: (What/you /do)? **“ What will you do?”**

a) (James / open / the window)?

b) (your mother / cook / a cake)?

c) (she / get / married) ?

d) (you / help / me / with my homework)?

e) (What / we / eat) ?

f) (When / Megan / be / famous) ?
