

Who 's or whose?

homophones

Whose : to ask about possession

example: « *Whose dog is it?* --> *It 's my cousin's dog.*»

Who 's 1. = **who is**

example: *Who 's ready for breakfast ?* = *Who **is** ready for breakfast ?*

or 2. = **who has** (+ got)

examples: *Who 's got my bag?* -> *It's Lucy, she 's got / she has got your bag.*
Who 's got blue eyes in your family ? -> *My sister has.*

EXERCISE: choose the correct form, whose or who's.

- schoolbag is it ? -> It's my schoolbag.
- funny in your family ? -> My Dad. He's very funny.
- glasses are they ? -> They're Peter's glasses
- hungry now? Who wants to go to the fastfood?
- got Tom 's schoolbag ? -> I think Ann has got Tom's schoolbag
- jacket is this ? -> This jacket belongs to Christopher.
- identity card is this? -> It's my sister's card.
- this boy on the photo? -> It's my cousin Ian.
- thirteen today? -> Jenny is. It's her birthday today.
- birthday is it today? -> It's Jenny's birthday today.
- absent today ? -> Nobody is absent today Miss.
- got a twin brother or twin sister in the class ? -> Nobody has.
