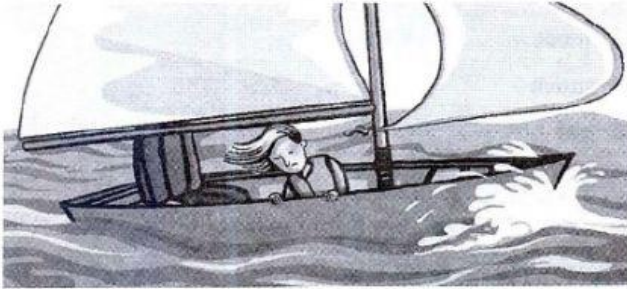

## A Have you ever been on TV?

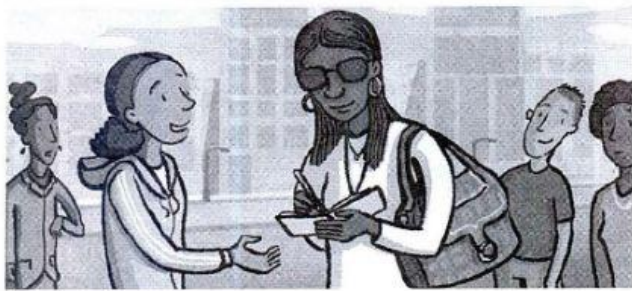

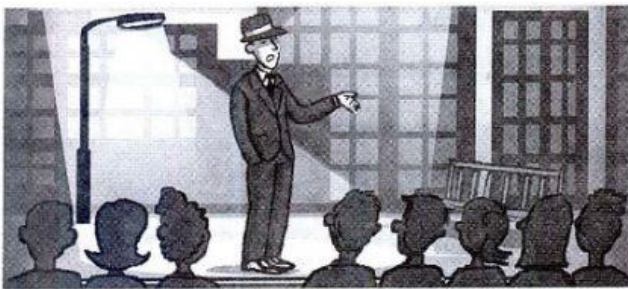

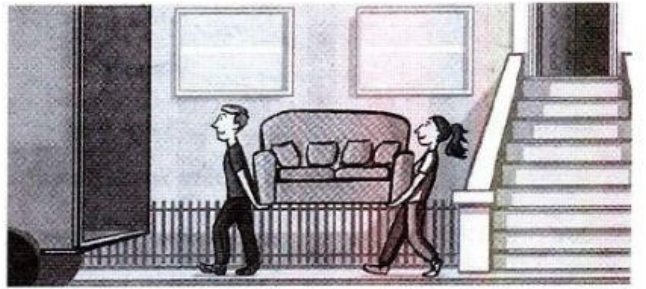
