at-in-on

at

at the street

WE KNOW NAME OF THE STREET AND ALSO THE NUMBER OF THE STREET

- Holmes lived at 221B Baker street.
- She lives at 55 Oxford street.
- Their house is 25 Harrison street.

at the end

WHEN YOU SAY AND MEAT SOME SPECIFIC TIME OR PLACE.

- At the end of the concert the audience clapped.
- Put a question mark at the end of that sentence.
- The shop is the end of this street.

at the beach

WE REFER TO THE LOCATION

- She wasn't at school, she was at the beach.
- We spent the afternoon at the beach.
- There are many cafes the beach.

at school

WHEN WE MEAN A LOCATION.

- She wasn't at school today.
- He was late because he helped his friends at school.
- The children are playing school.

in

in the street

STANDING IN THE MIDDLE OF THE STREET

- The children played in the street.
- Yesterday I met Henry in the street.
- There are lots of tourists the street.

in the end

WHEN YOU WANT TO SAY THE RESULT, AND OUTCOME OF THE SITUATION.

- I knew that everything would turn out fine in the end.
- Everything will be okay in the end.
- the end we found the house.

in school

WHEN WE MEAN THE INSTITUTION.

- She's the most popular teacher in school.
- I am doing well in school.
- He wanted to improve his marks school.

in water

WHEN YOU SWIM IN THE WATER. (lakes, rivers, oceans and other bodies of water)

- They can go fishing in the lake.
- He was throwing pebbles in the river.
- There's always more fish the sea.

in the river

WHEN YOU SWIM IN THE WATER.

- They are fishing in the river.
- I saw an interesting sea in the river.
- The dog fell the river.

on

on the street

WHEN WE KNOW ONLY THE NAME OF THE STREET.

- Her house is on Maple street.
- He lived on Baker street.
- They live Main street.

on the beach

WE MEAN BEING ON THE SHORE OR STANDING ON THE SAND.

- Tourists here like to walk on the beach.
- We collected shells on the beach.
- I just want to lie the beach and sunbathe.

on water

WHEN YOU ARE FLOATING ON THE SURFACE OF THE WATER OR YOU'RE STANDING ON THE SHORE. (lakes, rivers, oceans and other bodies of water).

- Ships sail on the sea.
- The ice on the river is thick enough to skate on.
- We go sailing the lake in summer.

on the river

THE SAME AS "ON THE WATER" RULE + WHEN SOMETHING STANDS NEXT TO THE RIVER.

- The capital is located on the river.
- He visited his relatives at their summerhouse on the river.
- Cambridge is the River Cam.
