### Modal verbs of obligation

- Strong positive obligations: *must*; *have/has to*; *need to*
- Weak obligations: *should*
- Strong negative obligations: *mustn't*
- No obligation (optional): *don't need to* / *don't have to*
- Positive advice: *should*
- Negative: *shouldn't*
