



EXAMS AND TESTS

2. Children take exams and tests at school.

The tests are called SATs (Standard Attainment Tests). Children take SATs at the age of 7, 11 and 14.

At the age of 16 some children take exams called GCSEs (General Certificate of Secondary Education).

Between the ages of 16 and 18, some children take AS level exams and then A2 level exams. Some children take BTECs (Business and Technology education Council).

Children get certificates to show their pass grades.
