



Present Perfect with **Ever** and **Never**

Ever

Ever means *at the time*. We can use ever in questions and goes between the verb have and past participle.

Example Sentences;

- Have you **ever** played basketball?
- Nobody has **ever** heard of this book.
- This is the first time I have **ever** eaten Italian pizza.
- Have you **ever** been to an opera?

Never

Never is a contraction of *of not ever*. We can use never to make a negative statement and goes between the verb have and the past participle.

Example Sentences;

- We should **never** have done that.
- He has **never** seen him.
 - We have **never** traveled by train.
 - We have **never** met with her until now.
 - I have **never** been to Spain.
