Welcome to the SAN DIEGO ZOO



When you're in the San Diego area, don't miss a visit to the San Diego Zoo. Here you'll meet some of the most exotic and rare creatures on earth - like cuddly koalas, hippos and our adorable giant pandas. Be sure to check out our fascinating exhibits like Polar Bear Plunge, Gorilla Tropics and Tiger River. And don't forget to visit monkey Trails, the San Diego Zoo's most elaborate animal habitat, which opened last spring.

TOURS AND ATTRACTIONS

Bus Tours Bus Tour tickets include a guided 35-minute bus tour and transportation on the Express Bus. The Express Bus allows you to hop on and off at five locations around the zoo all day. Guided tour departures are at the main entry near the Flamingo Lagoon. Hop off at Stop 3 for Polar Bears and at Stop 2 for giant pandas. Bus tickets can be purchased at all bus/Skyfari ticket booths.

Skyfari Aerial Tram The aerial tram offers spectacular views over the treetops to the other side of the zoo. Tickets and departures from two terminals: east terminal is left of the main entrance, across from the Reptile House; west terminal is next to Polar Bear Plunge. Please be advised that children under eight must be accompanied by an adult.

The Children's Zoo This delightful collection of more than 30 exhibits allows animal lovers of all ages a close encounter with some of our most well-loved species. Special walk-around presentations throughout the day bring you close to many interesting animals and let you talk to their caretakers.

EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

The Zoological Society of San Diego provides many different programmes for people of all ages, both on the grounds and around the world. More than 150,000 students who live in San Diego County take advantage of complimentary education programmes each year. We offer lectures, tours and workshops for adults, as well as unique summer classes for children with parent participation programmes which include sleepovers. GUEST SERVICES

Rentals Strollers, lockers, binoculars and motorized wheelchairs are available for rent near the entrance on a first-come, first-served basis. **Prices:** strollers or double strollers \$11 (\$2 deposit); wheelchairs \$6; electric scooters \$30 (\$100 deposit - credit card required). Coin-operated lockers are available for guests behind the Reptile House.

Guests with Disabilities The San Diego Zoo provides special parking, restrooms, telephones and access to shows, tour buses and exhibits for guests with disabilities. There are special buses for the hearing impaired. Please call in advance for an interpreter. A free shuttle bus operates inside the zoo for those with limited mobility or those who need special assistance.
