FIRE DEVASTATES CUTTY SARK

The Cutty Sark ship, one of London's most popular tourist attractions, _____

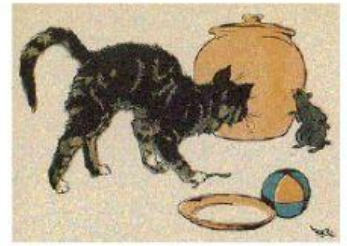
