The idea of a space station was once considered **unimaginable** until it became clear in the 1940s that the building of such a structure could be achieved. The first space station was created in 1969 when two Russian vehicles were linked in space. In 1984, the US President Ronald Reagan directed NASA to build the International Space Station (ISS) within a decade. The first component of the ISS was launched into space in 1998 with the first astronauts arriving in 2000. The station was the outcome of scientific collaboration between 5 space agencies which represent 15 countries. Since it was built, more than 200 astronauts from 19 different countries have arrived at the ISS. Those astronauts use the station as a platform to conduct scientific research and experiments. In 2010, the station was assigned more roles of serving educational and diplomatic purposes.
