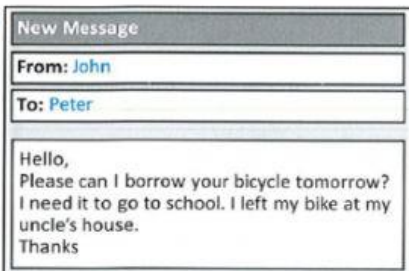

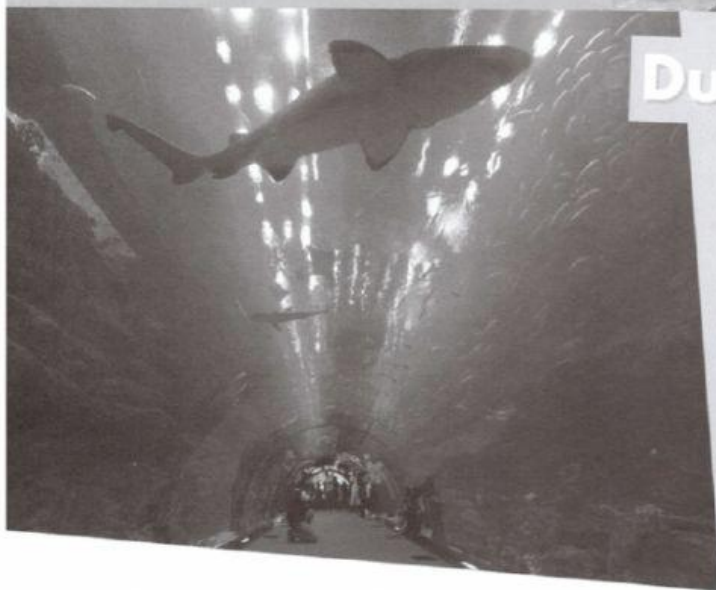
West Edmonton Mall
