can, can't and must

We use **can + infinitive without to** to talk about things that are possible, or that we are able to do.

Can we go with them?
You **can** live with us, too.

We use **can't + infinitive without to** to talk about things that aren't possible, or that we aren't able to do.

Smee **can't** see Hook in the fog.

We use **must + infinitive without to** to talk about things that we have to do.

You **must** stay with the boys.
