FUTURE PERFECT SIMPLE AND FUTURE PERFECT CONTINUOUS

In **both tenses** we are imagining ourselves in the **future** and **looking back**.



FUTURE PERFECT SIMPLE AND FUTURE PERFECT CONTINUOUS

- By the middle of November, penguins **will have laid** two eggs.
- Imagine, in February, **I will have been working** with penguins for almost 3 months.

Which one do we use?

1. To talk about an action that will be completed before a specific time in the future
2. To talk about an action that will be in progress at a specific time in the future.

FUTURE PERFECT SIMPLE AND FUTURE PERFECT CONTINUOUS

- By the middle of November, penguins **will have laid** two eggs.
- Imagine, in February, **I will have been working** with penguins for almost 3 months.

Future perfect simple is formed with **will + have/had + past/past participle**

Future perfect continuous is formed by **will have + be/been + verb ed / verb ing**
