


# WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?



## SEE

- When an imagine comes to your eyes (without intent).
- "She opened the door and **saw** me standing there."



## LOOK

- To see something with intent and attention (often used with the preposition AT).
- "Susan **looked at** the menu before ordering his meal."



## WATCH

- To look intensely at something (often something that is moving).
- We **watched** the plane take off."




### EXERCISE 1
