5. If the dress (not / be) so tight (small), I (wear) it tonight.

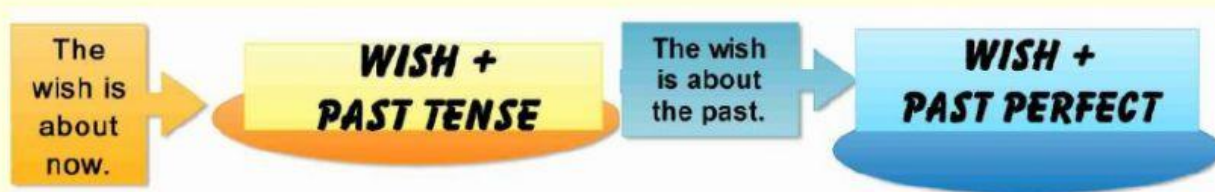
