

Shanghai noise pollution issue

There are approximately 24 million people living in Shanghai, China. It is one of the world's most populated cities. The city is known as the entertainment, commercial and fashion capital of China. There is serious overpopulation, it is China's most crowded city and there is severe traffic congestion. According to government figures, there are around 27,000 noise complaints every year. The worst offenders include the ever-present loudspeakers, the constant construction work, firecrackers which are traditionally set off during China's many festivals, car horns, rickshaws and taxis. All of these combined contribute to noise levels which measure over 100 decibels. To put this in perspective, this is as loud as a jet plane taking off. This continues around the clock, 24 hours a day. But, in recent months, Shanghai has looked to a much smaller city for ways to successfully reduce noise pollution. The city of Yinchuan in northwest China came out as the quietest of 46 cities in China following an environmental survey. Despite more than two million people living there, the city boasts a decibel level of only 50.1, half that of Shanghai, and about as loud as a flowing stream.

The city has achieved this by moving all the noisy factories out of the urban areas and banning drivers from honking their horns. Back in Shanghai, people are no longer allowed to play musical instruments or other audio equipment in parks and other public areas between 10pm and 6am.
