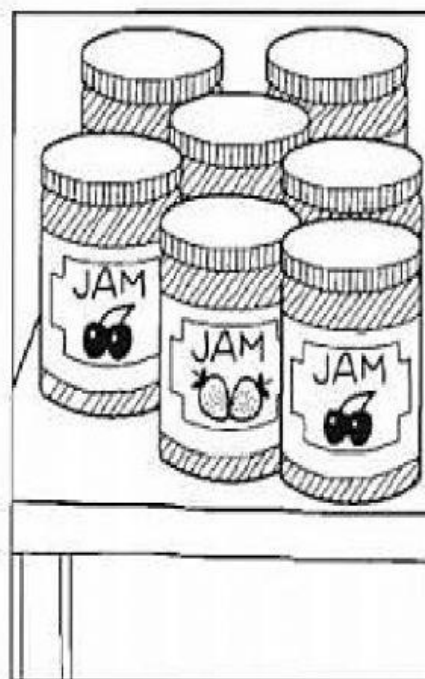
Task 3:
