*Match the types of containers with their definitions:*

<b>Tanktainer</b>		<b>1</b>	A shipping container used in intermodal freight for temperature sensitive perishable cargo.
<b>Open top container</b>		<b>2</b>	A container designed to hold wide cargo that does not fit inside a standard container.
<b>Reefer</b>		<b>3</b>	An intermodal container for the transport of liquids, gases and powders as bulk cargo.
<b>Flat rack container</b>		<b>4</b>	A shipping unit designed to hold nonspecific types of goods without special equipment, protective gear or other parts to preserve the condition of the contents.
<b>GP container Dry cargo</b>		<b>5</b>	A container fitted with a solid removable roof, or with a tarpaulin roof so it can be loaded or unloaded from the top.
