

7 wonders of Russia

1  Mount Elbrus	A located in southern Russia is a dominant height overlooking the city of Volgograd. The site hosts a memorial complex that was built to commemorate the Battle of Stalingrad, infamous as one of the deadliest battles in the history of humankind.
 2 The Manpupuner rock formations	B. Located in Moscow's Red Square, the church was commissioned by Ivan the Terrible and built from 1555 to 1561. The church served as the tallest building in the city, shaped in the form of a bonfire's flame rising into the sky. It is also part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Moscow Kremlin and Red Square.
 3 Saint Basil's Cathedral	C. is about 25-30 million years. It is the deepest lake in the world, located in southern Siberia, containing nearly a quarter of the world's fresh surface water
 4 The Peterhof Palace	D. is situated in Kamchatka and consists of hundreds of survivors geysers. It is in the list of UNESCO cultural heritage of the world.
 5 Mamayev Kurgan with <u>The Motherland Calls</u> statue	E. the highest mountain in Russia, the tenth most prominent peak in the world, a dormant volcano

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6 The Valley of Geysers

F. a series of gardens and palaces located in a municipal town in the federal city of St. Petersburg. It is famed for its beautiful landscape, and is often nicknamed as the "Russian Versailles." It has been recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in Russia.



7 Lake Baikal

G. a set of 7 stone pillars located west of the Ural mountains in the Troitsko-Pechorsky District of the Komi Republic. These monoliths are between 30 and 42 m high and jut out of a hilly plateau formed through the weathering effects of ice and winds.

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
