Page 22 – Exercise 1:

The first calendar was created in Rome by Julius Caesar. The months of January, March, May, July, September and November all had 31 days. April, June, August, October and December only had 30, so people thought these 30 day months were unlucky. The second month of the year usually has 28 days; every four years however, it has 29. Those special years are what we now call leap years.

On the 8th month of the year, Rome's first Emperor Augustus won a very important battle and decided to name this month after himself. Since August only had 30 days and was considered unlucky, he decided to take one day from February and add it to August. He also decided to change the months of October and December to have 31 days, and September and November to have 30.
