"Mothers of the Disappeared" is a song by the rock band \_\_\_\_\_. It is the eleventh and final track on their 1987 album \_\_\_\_\_. The song was inspired by lead \_\_\_\_\_

Bono's experiences in Nicaragua and El Salvador in July 1986, following U2's involvement on Amnesty International's A Conspiracy of Hope tour. He learned about \_\_\_\_\_, a group

of women whose children had been "disappeared" by the Argentine and Chilean dictatorships. While in Central America, he met members of COMADRES, a similar organization whose \_\_\_\_\_ had been disappeared by the government in El Salvador. Bono sympathized with the Madres and COMADRES and wanted to pay tribute to their cause.



The Mothers of the Plaza de Mayo is an association of Argentine \_\_\_\_\_ whose children were "disappeared" during the Dirty War of the military dictatorship between \_\_\_\_\_ and 1983.
