

CONDITIONALS

Zero conditional: (something which is always true)

If you stand in the rain, you get wet.

You get wet if you stand in the rain.

If you heat ice, it melts.

Ice melts if you heat it

If I pour red color into white color, I get pink color.

IF/WHEN + PRESENT SIMPLE + PRESENT SIMPLE

If he doesn't wear his coat, he will get cold.

If you have a headache, take an aspirin.

Second conditional: (imaginary situation in the present or the future, also use to give advice)

If I won the lottery, I would travel a lot.

If I were you, I would call my dad for help.

IF + PAST SIMPLE + WOULD + BARE VERB

(We can use either were or was with I/he/she/it)

If he were/was older, he would travel around Europe.
