I see what you mean...

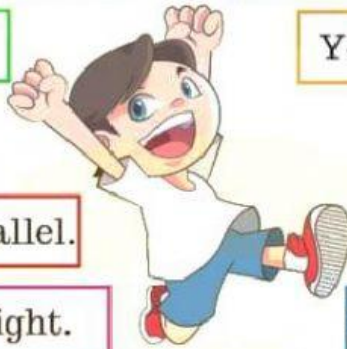
I had that same idea.
